2025 Spring Report for Donors

We are pleased to share that Society President Dr. Sharon Cohen and Executive Director Kevin Fadum will travel to Kakamega in June 2025 to observe the scholarship intake interviews. Approximately 300 shortlisted applicants will be invited to our office to interview with an alumni panel, who will select about 150 students for home visits before the successful recipients are announced in August.

Thanks to your generosity, 274 continuing ACCES-sponsored post-secondary students and 80 new beneficiaries will begin the school year in September. In December 2025, we expect that 82 students will graduate from their programs of study, and we will start 2026 with 272 continuing students.
